Together with the New Jersey Association of Community Providers (NJACP), of which Alternatives is a member agency, we worked to support the "Keep the Lights On" campaign, to advocate for an increase in funding that takes into account the challenges associated with inflation and other fiscal pressures.

I am grateful to our dedicated Board of Trustees, who continue to support our mission in every aspect, through good and challenging times, despite their own full lives. I am also thankful for the community of supporters who stand behind our philosophy and support it through fundraising and advocacy efforts.

Mary Lynn's Story

Mary Lynn lived an average life filled with what most of us would term typical rites of passage. Originally from Morris County, Mary Lynn studied Nutrition and Communications at Glassboro State College (now Rowan University) for two years. She then worked as a broker's assistant for a financial services company.

Mary Lynn moved to Somerset County, had children and married. She describes these good years as nothing out of the ordinary - she was a stay-at-home mom who enjoyed cooking and gardening. In 2003, she divorced and went back to working in finance, but things were far from ordinary then. Mary Lynn became overwhelmed with feelings of anxiety and paranoia, and she lost custody of her son - an episode that resulted in years of soul searching.

It seemed as though the bottom had dropped out of Mary Lynn's life. She was homeless and alone, but somehow there was a glimmer of who she once was, and who she could become. She enrolled as a finance student at Morris Community College, and made the Dean's List, as she was showering at the school and sleeping in the parking lot. Finally, Mary Lynn reached out to the Board of Social Services and was placed in a shelter.

In 2010, Mary Lynn obtained services with Alternatives and entered the Permanent Housing Program. She had a new job as a temporary worker with the Office on Aging and was sure she had her life together. Mary Lynn left Alternatives, thinking it was a crutch from which she could be free. But, the overwhelming anxiety and feelings of dread returned, and she found herself searching for the support that she received through her team of case workers and behavioral health professionals at Alternatives. She returned to Alternatives, and today, Mary Lynn receives the support she needs while also supporting others.



Mary Lynn still receives supportive services, but she now lives in her own apartment and is her father's caretaker. She is active in the lives of her sons, as well as her beloved grandson. In an effort to give back to the community that supported her needs, Mary Lynn enjoys volunteering for organizations that serve people who are traveling a road similar to the one she experienced. Mary Lynn is a frequent volunteer at SHIP, Home Now and at the St. Francis Inn in Philadelphia. With an eye toward constantly moving forward, Mary Lynn is destined to Reach New Heights.

Valerie's Story

Valerie is a woman who embodies the phrase "Reaching New Heights." Growing up in the 1950s and 60s with a developmental disability was far different than what is experienced today. Val lived at home with her parents and siblings and attended the Bridgewater School System and then The Midland School and graduated in 1975. These were difficult years for Val, when she was often ridiculed for her learning differences, but she was learning lifelong lessons at this time in addition occupational training.

Because Valerie remembers Midland as the first place where she could feel comfortable and be present without judgement, she credits the early years for instilling in her a volunteer spirit that she continues to share with others today. It was also the place where she met, Greg, her husband of 33 years.

Valerie and Greg came to Alternatives as a couple, in 1992, and remained clients until Greg's death in 2021. During that time, Alternatives encouraged Valerie's growing independence and desire to be involved in the community. Although she worked several jobs over the years, her many volunteer positions were and continue to be where she thrives and grows.

Valerie's resume of accomplishments is long and varied. She actively supports Alternatives as a member of the Dignity Gala Committee, while she also volunteers for the Laurel Circle in Bridgewater. She gives back to her home town of Somerville in countless ways – she is Co-President of the Civic League, is active in the Business and Professional Association, and helps the parish of St. John in multiple ways. In addition, the Somerville Library has dubbed Valerie the "finder of books," because of her expertise in conducting book inventories. When Val isn't volunteering, she is making beautiful craft projects, often to be donated to organizations where she volunteers and others. Valerie has received several awards over the years – Somerset County United Way Circle of Excellence Award, Somerset County Federation of Democratic Women Extraordinary Volunteer Service Award, Somerset County Profiles of Positive Aging Award and The Alternatives, Inc. Dignity Award which she shared with the Gibson Family.

When asked why she remains so constantly busy, Valerie shyly smiles and admits that it's something that she feels she needs to do! "So many people have helped me in my life – I want to help others in return."



Lots of Fun!


Springtime brought with it the return of our elegant affair, the Dignity Gala and 18 holes of friendly competition at the Dignity Golf Outing.
